where Christ sits on his throne at the right side of God. 2 Keep your minds fixed on things there, not on things here on earth. 3 For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. 4 Your real life is Christ and when he appears, then you too will appear with him and share his glory!

The Old Life and the New

⁵ You must put to death, then, the earthly desires at work in you, such as sexual immorality, indecency, lust, evil passions, and greed (for greed is a form of idolatry). 6 Because of such things God's anger will come upon those who do not obey him. 7 At one time you yourselves used to live according to such desires, when your life was domi-

nated by them.

8 But now you must get rid of all these things: anger, passion, and hateful feelings. No insults or obscene talk must ever come from your lips. 9 Do not lie to one another, for you have put off the old self with its habits 10 and have put on the new self. This is the new being which God, its Creator, is constantly renewing in his own image, in order to bring you to a full knowledge of himself. 11 As a result, there is no longer any distinction between Gentiles and Jews, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarians, savages, slaves, and free men, but Christ is all, Christ is in all.

12 You are the people of God; he loved you and chose you for his own. So then, you must clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience. 13 Be tolerant with one another and forgive one another whenever any of you has a complaint against someone else. You must forgive one another just as the Lord has forgiven you. 14 And to all these qualities add love, which binds all things together in perfect unity. 15 The peace that Christ gives is to guide you in the decisions you make; for it iss to this peace hat God has called vou together in the one body. And be thankfil. 16 Christ's message i in all its richnes must live in your hearts. Teach and instruct one anothher with all wislom. Sing psalms, hymnns, and sacrec songs; sing to Good with thank giving in your lhearts. 17 Everthing you do or sayy, then, shouldbe done in the namee of the Lord esus, as you give thanks through him to God the Fathher.

18 Wves, submit yourselves to your hisbands, for that is what you shoulddo as Christians.

19 Hisbands, love your wives and

do notbe harsh with them.

20 Children, it is your Chhristian duty to obey your parents always. for tha is what pleases God.l.

21 Paents, do not irritate ycour children, or they will become cdiscour-

aged.

22 Slaves, obey your humaan masters in all things, not only whhen they are waching you because you want to gaintheir approval; but doo it with a since heart because of your reverencefor the Lord. 23 Whateever you do, wok at it with all your hheart, as though you were working for the Lord and not for men. 24 Renmember that the Lord will give you as a reward vhat he has kept for this people. Fo Christ is the real Masster you serve. 25 And every wrongddoer will be regaid for the wrong things he does, lecause God judges egyervone by thesame standard.

Misters, be fair and just in the way you treat your slavves. Remember that you too have a Master

in hearen.
